make
sudo make install
```

```
pcf2vpnc Support_template.pcf > /etc/vpnc/foobar.conf
```

## Start connection

```
sudo /usr/local/sbin/vpnc --no-detach --debug 2 foobar
```

## Fix routes

I didn't like that all my traffic was going over VPN

```
sudo route del default
route add default gw 192.168.1.1
route add -net 192.168.4.0 netmask 255.255.255.0 dev tun0
```
