

Turning Off Your Computer

- 2. Shut down the operating system:


Ensure that the computer and all attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button until the computer turns off.



Flashing the BIOS From a CD

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.
- MOTE: If you use a BIOS-update program CD to flash the BIOS, set up the computer to boot from a CD before inserting the CD.



2. Insert the BIOS-update program CD, and restart the computer.

Follow the instructions that appear on the screen. The computer continues to boot and updates the new BIOS. When the flash update is complete, the computer will automatically reboot.

- 3. Press <0> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 4. Press <Fn> and <F9> to reset the computer defaults.
- 5. Press <Esc>, select Save changes and reboot, and press <Enter> to save configuration changes.
- 6. Remove the flash BIOS-update program CD from the drive and restart the computer

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in, the main battery is properly installed, and a network cable is attached.
- 2. Turn on the computer.
- 3. Locate the latest BIOS update file for your computer at support.dell.com.

Replacing the Display Assembly

- 1. Align the display hinges with the holes in the base of the computer and then lower the display into place.
- 2. Replace and tighten the two display assembly hinge screws.
- 3. Carefully route the display cables and the speaker cable into their routing guides and connect them to the respective system board connectors.
- 4. Carefully slide the Mini-Card antenna cables through the system board and into their routing guides.
- 5. Replace the palm rest (see Replacing the Palm Rest).
- 6. Replace the keyboard (see Replacing the Keyboard).
- 7. Replace the module cover (see Replacing the Module Cover).
- 8. Slide the battery into the battery bay, until it clicks in place and slide the battery-lock latch towards the lock position.

Replacing the Keyboard






- 3. Use your fingertips to carefully spread apart the securing clips on each end of the memory module connector until the module pops up.
- 4. Remove the memory module from the connector.

Replacing the Memory Module



- 1. Follow the instructions in Before You Begin.
- 2. Align the notch in the memory module edge connector with the tab in the memory module connector slot.
- 3. Slide the memory module firmly into the slot at a 45-degree angle, and rotate the memory module down until it clicks into place. If the module does not click into place, remove the memory module and reinstall it.

NOTE: If the memory module is not installed properly, the computer may not boot. No error message indicates this failure.





- NOTICE: If the cover is difficult to close, remove the module and reinstall it. Forcing the cover to close may damage your computer.
- 4. Replace the module cover (see Replacing the Module Cover).
- 5. Slide the battery into the battery bay until it clicks into place and slide the battery-lock latch to the lock position.
- 6. Turn on the computer.

As the computer boots, it detects the additional memory and automatically updates the system configuration information.



1 Two Full Mini-Card slots - for WLAN and Mobile Broadband or WWAN


MOTE: Depending on the configuration of the computer when it was sold, the Mini-Card slots may not have Mini-Cards installed in them.

Your computer supports two types of wireless Mini-Cards:

- 1 Wireless Local Area Network (WLAN)
- 1 Mobile Broadband or Wireless Wide Area Network (WWAN)

Removing the Mini-Card

- 1. Follow the instructions in Before You Begin.
- 2. Remove the module cover (see Removing the Module Cover).

- 3. Disconnect the antenna cables from the Mini-Card.
- 4. Release the Mini-Card by removing the securing screws.
- 5. Lift the Mini-Card out of its system board connector.



NOTICE: When the Mini-Card is not in the computer, store it in protective antistatic packaging. See the information on protection against electrostatic discharge in the safety information that shipped with your computer.

Replacing the Mini-Card

- NOTICE: The connectors are keyed to ensure correct insertion. If you feel resistance, check the connectors on the card and on the system board, and realign the card.
- NOTICE: To avoid damage to the Mini-Card, never place cables under the card.
- 1. Follow the instructions in <u>Before You Begin</u>.
- 2. Remove the new Mini-Card from its packing.
- NOTICE: Use firm and even pressure to slide the card into place. If you use excessive force, you may damage the connector.

- 3. Insert the Mini-Card at a 45-degree angle into the appropriate system board connector. For example, the WLAN card connector is labeled WLAN and so
- 4. Press the other end of the WLAN card down into the slot on the system board and replace the two securing screws.
- 5. Connect the appropriate antenna cables to the Mini-Card you are installing. The following table provides the antenna cable color scheme for each Mini-Card supported by your computer.

Connectors on the Mini-Card	Antenna Cable Color Scheme
WWAN (2 antenna cables)	
Main WWAN (white triangle)	white with gray stripe
Auxiliary WWAN (black triangle)	black with gray stripe
WLAN (2 or 3 antenna cables)	
Main WLAN (white triangle)	white
Auxiliary WLAN (black triangle)	black
WPAN (one antenna cable)	
WPAN	blue

- 6. Secure unused antenna cables in the protective mylar sleeve.
- 7. Replace the module cover (see Replacing the Module Cover).
- 8. Slide the battery into the battery bay, until it clicks in place and slide the battery-lock latch to the lock position.
- 9. Install the drivers and utilities for your computer, as required. For more information, see the Dell Technology Guide.



NOTE: If you are installing a communication card from a source other than Dell, you must install the appropriate drivers and utilities. For more information, see the Dell Technology Guide.





- 4. Turn the computer over and remove the left and right rubber bumpers.
- 5. Remove the nine screws from the computer base.



- 6. Turn the computer over and remove the seven screws from the top of the palm rest.
- 7. Disconnect the Bluetooth card cable, touch pad cable, and the power button cable from the respective system board connectors.

- 8. Starting at the top of the palm rest, use your fingers to gently ease the palm rest from the computer base by lifting the inside of the palm rest while pulling in on the outside.
- MOTE: The thermal pads may stick to the bottom of the palm rest. Remove the thermal pads from the bottom of the palm rest.
- 9. Remove the thermal pads from the processor, North Bridge, and South Bridge.

Replacing the Palm Rest

1. Remove the centrifugal paper of the thermal pads, that shipped with your new palm rest, and paste it on the processor, North Bridge, and South Bridge.

- 2. Align the tabs of the palm rest with the computer base.
- 3. Gently snap the palm rest into place.
- 4. Connect the Bluetooth card cable, touch pad cable, and the power button cable to the respective system board connectors.
- 5. Replace the seven screws on the top of the palm rest.

- 6. Turn the computer over and replace the nine screws in the computer base.
- 7. Replace the left and right rubber bumpers.
- 8. Replace the keyboard (see Replacing the Keyboard).
- 9. Replace the module cover (see Replacing the Module Cover).
- 10. Slide the battery into the battery bay, until it clicks in place and slide the battery-lock latch towards the lock position.



Replacing the Solid-state Drive

- 1. Remove the new drive from its packaging.
- 2. Insert the solid-state drive into the slot at a 45-degree angle.
- 3. Press the solid-state drive down and replace the two screws that secure the drive.
- 4. Replace the module cover (see Replacing the Module Cover).
- 5. Slide the battery into the battery bay, until it clicks into place and slide the battery-lock latch towards the lock position.

- NOTICE: Before turning on the computer, replace all screws and ensure that no stray screws remain inside the computer. Failure to do so may result in damage to the computer.
- 6. Install the operating system for your computer, as needed (see "Restoring Your Operating System" in your computer Setup Guide or Ubuntu Quick Start Guide).
- 7. Install the drivers and utilities for your computer, as needed (see "Reinstalling Drivers and Utilities" in your computer Setup Guide).

The system board's BIOS chip contains the service tag, which is also visible on a barcode label at the bottom of the computer.

Follow these instructions to enter the service tag -

Manually:

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.
- 2. Press <0> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 3. Navigate to the security tab and enter the service tag in the Set Service Tag field.

Using CD:

The replacement kit for the system board includes a CD that provides a utility for transferring the service tag to the replacement system board.



NOTE: Your computer may or may not ship with an external optical drive. Use an external optical drive or any external storage device for the procedures that involve discs.



NOTICE: Handle components and cards by their edges, and avoid touching pins and contacts.

Removing the System Board

- 3. Remove the memory module (see Removing the Memory Module).
- 4. Remove the solid-state drive (see Removing the Solid-state Drive).

- 8. Disconnect the microphone cable and AC adapter cable from the respective system board connectors.
- 9. Remove the two screws that secure the system board to the computer base.
- 10. Lift the system board at an angle towards the side of the computer and out of the computer base.

Replacing the System Board

NOTE: The thermal pads may stick to the bottom of the palm rest. Remove the thermal pads from the bottom of the palm rest.

1. Remove the centrifugal paper of the thermal pads that shipped with your new system board and paste it on the processor, North Bridge, and South Bridge.

2. Follow all of the steps in Removing the System Board in reverse order.



- 3. Turn on the computer.
- NOTE: After you have replaced the system board, enter the computer Service Tag into the BIOS of the replacement system board.
- 4. Insert the CD that accompanied the replacement system board into the appropriate drive. Follow the instructions that appear on the screen.
- 5. The keyboard matrix may change after you replace the system board. To set the keyboard matrix according to your country, see Setting the Keyboard Matrix.

Setting the Keyboard Matrix

- 1. Turn off your computer (see <u>Turning Off Your Computer</u>).
- 2. If your computer is connected to the AC adapter, disconnect the AC adapter from the computer.
- 3. Press and hold the following key combination for the desired keyboard matrix:
 - o United States: <Fn><S>
 - o United Kingdom: <Fn><K>
 - o Japan: <Fn><J>

- o Korea: <Fn><E>
- 4. Connect the AC adapter to the computer and then plug it into a wall outlet or surge protector.
- 5. Release the key combination.
