dependencies

```
apt-get install libreadline-dev
```

checkout source

```
svn co https://urjtag.svn.sourceforge.net/svnroot/urjtag/trunk urjtag
cd unrjtag
```

include

```
cd include
./autogen.sh
sudo make install
cd ..
```

jtag

```
cd jtag
./autogen.sh
make
make install
```

Connect to device

Load kernel module

```
modprobe ppdev
```

Start jtag tool

```
$ jtag
jtag> cable ppdev /dev/parport0 WIGGLER
Initializing Macraigor Wiggler JTAG Cable on ppdev port /dev/parport0
jtag> detect
```
